Rapid Urban Micro-Heat Mapping and Cooling Strategy for Coastal Tourism and Public Health: An Urban Planning Study

Abstract

Coastal secondary cities in Southeast Asia face increasing thermal stress due to rapid urbanization, high impervious surface coverage, and climate change-driven temperature rise. Vũng Tàu City, located in Bà Rịa-Vũng Tàu Province, Vietnam, is a coastal tourism center with approximately 460,000 residents and a built environment characterized by dense commercial corridors, paved beachfront promenades, residential zones, and expanding transportation infrastructure. This study is structured as a case study of Vũng Tàu City, designed to demonstrate how targeted micro-scale thermal assessment can strengthen both tourism capacity and public health resilience in the context of rising temperatures associated with global warming. As a coastal destination dependent on walkability, outdoor recreation, and beach-oriented commerce, Vũng Tàu's economic vitality is directly influenced by thermal comfort. Simultaneously, increasing heat exposure presents heightened vulnerability for elderly residents, outdoor workers, and visitors. By integrating thermal mapping with urban planning strategies, the study positions climate adaptation as both an economic development strategy and a public health response. This research contributes to emerging discourse on scalable, low-cost climate resilience strategies for secondary coastal cities in the Global South. It demonstrates that rapid micro-heat mapping can serve as a decision-support tool for integrating vegetation planning, stormwater management, tourism development, and public health preparedness into cohesive urban cooling strategies. The model is replicable in similar mid-sized tropical cities seeking practical adaptation measures under constrained time and resource conditions.

Artificial Intelligence for Sustainability Problem-Solving: A Model for Practitioners

Abstract

The accelerating impacts of climate change, rapid urbanization, and environmental degradation are reshaping the global sustainability workforce. The World Economic Forum reports that demand for sustainability-trained professionals has risen by approximately 40% since 2015, yet only a small fraction of the labor force possesses the required interdisciplinary competencies. Concurrently, Deloitte Insights (2026) highlights a widening gap in artificial intelligence (AI) literacy within sustainability-related roles, particularly in climate analytics, ESG reporting, infrastructure planning, and environmental risk assessment. This dual skills deficit, limited sustainability fluency among technologists, and insufficient AI capability among sustainability practitioners pose a significant barrier to effective place-based problem-solving.

This paper presents a practitioner-centered, workshop-based model for integrating AI into sustainability decision-making. Unlike institutional or center-based educational frameworks, the proposed model emphasizes hands-on, rapid skill transfer tailored to professionals operating in geographically specific contexts such as urban planning, environmental consulting, engineering, property development, and governmental compliance. The model is demonstrated through a case-based prototype workshop conducted in Vietnam, focusing on AI-assisted flood risk and climate resilience mapping in the Mekong Delta, one of the world's most climate-vulnerable regions.

The workshop integrates open-source geospatial tools, such as QGIS and Google Earth Engine, with satellite datasets (Sentinel-2, SRTM elevation data, CHIRPS rainfall data) to construct a place-based flood-susceptibility model. Machine learning techniques, including Random Forest (RF) and Support Vector Machines (SVM), are introduced to classify flood risk zones based on elevation, hydrological proximity, and rainfall intensity. Remote sensing workflows incorporate land-use/land-cover (LULC) classification and change detection to support infrastructure planning and climate adaptation strategies. In parallel, Large Language Models (LLMs) are employed to translate spatial risk outputs into policy-ready resilience recommendations, environmental compliance drafts, and adaptation briefs aligned with national climate frameworks.

The model moves beyond theoretical AI training by embedding practitioners directly within applied analytical pipelines, from data ingestion and preprocessing to spatial modeling, visualization, and regulatory reporting. Participants learn structured prompt engineering for sustainability scenarios, enabling them to generate context-sensitive adaptation strategies, infrastructure planning insights, and risk communication summaries. By combining geospatial analytics, remote sensing, machine learning, and generative AI, the workshop framework equips professionals with hybrid competencies that reflect the evolving demands of climate governance.

The United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change estimates that approximately 3.3 billion people are highly vulnerable to climate impacts, with Southeast Asia among the most exposed regions. Addressing such vulnerability requires not only technological innovation but also the democratization of applied AI skills among frontline practitioners. The workshop-based model proposed here offers a scalable and context-aware pathway for operationalizing AI in sustainability practice. It positions AI not as an abstract innovation, but as an augmentation tool that enhances analytical rigor, accelerates evidence synthesis, and strengthens resilience-oriented planning.

By prioritizing skill transfer, open-source tools, and place-based applications, this model contributes a practical framework for closing the AI-sustainability capability gap and enabling climate-responsive decision-making in vulnerable regions.
